Senior Pilgrim Fellowship (SPF) at Greenfield Hill Congregational Church *What it is – and what we covenant together*

What it is: SPF was begun, many years ago, as the high school youth group at Greenfield Hill Church. Over the years, as friends brought friends, SPF became a group to which *any* teen in the community was welcome, regardless of religious background. The aim, then and now, is to provide a place where teenagers can be with one another in an atmosphere of respect and care, free to talk together about the issues which concern them.

Who runs the program: Rev. Alida Ward, pastor at Greenfield Hill Church, has led SPF since 1989. But not solo! SPF has a wonderful team of 10-12 adult leaders each year. Our leaders are church members and friends who enjoy our teens, and the chance to be part of these exciting years.

What happens at a Thursday night meeting: We gather at 6:00, with pizza served at 6:10. At 6:30, we have a short period of devotions (frequently readings or videos contributed by our youth). From 6:35 to 7:25 is program time, which includes anything from 'open topic' discussions, to visits from interesting speakers, to the occasional "just for fun" evening. Guests have included such speakers as John Trautwein, Det. Beth Leetch, local school counselor Tim Morris, Cindi Bigelow, and many others!

Dues: There are none! But we will be asking participants to contribute pizza or desserts throughout the year, to keep us fed!



(Yes, we do get silly!)



Communication: We reach out to the kids (and parents) each week via email, Facebook posts, and text messages. Appalachia: A highlight of our SPF program is the summer Appalachia trip, which will

take place from June 28 to July 5, 2025. During these eight days, we participate with the Appalachia Service Project, Inc., to repair homes for families in need. The costs of the trip are met in two ways: by an individual fee of \$725 per child, and by fundraising through the year (actual cost to take each youth is well over \$1000). Please note that the ASP trip is *for SPF participants* – being active at SPF is a requirement to sign up for ASP!

This life-changing trip also needs **adult** participants! Please be in touch with Alida if you, or others you know, have an interest in coming along as an adult leader. No home repair experience needed! just a heart for service and for teens!



A note about Greenfield Hill Church and its pastors: Just as SPF is open to all, the ministry of this church is open to all. Rev. Alida Ward and Rev. David Rowe, married co-pastors, are always glad to talk with you about your kids, or any way else that we can be of service to you. Our worship on Sundays is also open to anyone, at any time (9:00 and 10:30)
